## **News from the Vic&Tas Branch**

## **February Event**

The SSA Vic & Tas branch kicked off the year with our first event in February with a seminar by Dr James Goldie from 360info titled "No installation required: instant coding demos and workshops using dev containers and WebR." We learnt about how to easily run coding workshops using two main

methods. Codespaces allows any Github user 120 core-hours of free computation per month, meaning anyone can set up a free account and run code in that environment for the duration of a workshop. WebR on the other hand runs the code directly in the user's browser. These environments work for both R and Python and are great for teaching purposes, so more time can be spent on coding and analysis. Thanks James for introducing us to these new tools!

#### **March Event**

In March the SSA Vic & Tas Branch hosted their AGM and successfully elected the council for 2024. The AGM was followed by a joint seminar by Helen Baird and Dr Fiona Manson from the Australian Bureau of Statistics about how the ABS develops standards. Helen began by explaining the importance of using statistical standards so that we can compare results from data collected by different people. She explained that the ABS strives to find a balance between updating standards so that they stay relevant and reflect the real world but also remain robust and consistent for time-series analysis. Fiona took us through the process of how standards are developed, emphasising the importance of using existing standards where possible and taking into account who will use the data and for what purpose.

## Empowering African statisticians: FAO's scholarships for agricultural data improvement

The Global Strategy to Improve Agricultural and Rural Statistics (GSARS), led by the Food and Agriculture Organisation of the United Nations (FAO), is offering scholarships to train young African statisticians in agricultural statistics.

This initiative aims to bridge the data gap in developing countries and improve agricultural productivity and sustainability.

An article published on 13 March 2024 on the website of the United Nation's FAO showcases two students enrolled in the master's program in agricultural statistics in Côte d'Ivoire, Désirée Christelle and Deborah Conan. These young women are learning about agricultural processes like tapping rubber trees to understand statistical concepts like yield. The master's program they're enrolled in combines theoretical knowledge with practical experience tailored to the challenges of the agricultural sector.

The FAO emphasises the importance of reliable agricultural statistics for policymaking, resource allocation and market planning. Through scholarships and training, the FAO seeks to address gender disparities in the field, with 43% of recent graduates being women.

The goal is to equip statisticians, particularly women, with the skills to provide accurate data for informed decision-making in agriculture.

## Brewing up statistics: The legacy of William Sealy Gosset, aka 'Student

What do beer and statistics have in common? If he were still alive, William Sealy Gosset would have the answer for you. He was a Guinness brewer, who made significant contributions to modern statistics under the pseudonym "Student" with his paper "The Probable Error of a Mean" published in 1908 by Biometrika. The paper introduced a technique for making precise forecasts using limited data, later recognised as "Student's t distribution," which has since become a fundamental tool in modern statistics and scientific inquiry.

Gosset's inspiration stemmed from challenges in assessing hop resin levels for brewing quality, demonstrating the method's utility in beer production. Despite initial obscurity, the method later gained recognition through Ronald Aylmer Fisher's endorsement.

Gosset's death in 1937 was followed by acknowledgment of his international reputation and advancements in agricultural experimentation methods. This narrative underscores the scientific rigour embedded in brewing and highlights the role of brewers like Gosset in advancing scientific research.

## **Canberra Branch Meeting - Optimising Twin Uniform Distribution for Multiplicative Noise Data Masking**

26 Mar 2024, 6:00 PM – 7:00 PM (AEDT), In-person and online via Zoom

SSA Canberra invites everyone to attend its post-AGM branch meeting, where our outgoing branch president Pauline Ding will be dazzling us with her research on data masking!

Multiplicative noise masking is a well-known method to perturb data for privacy protection purpose. Twin uniform distribution has been introduced in the literature as a distribution for multiplicative noise, given the simplicity in its mathematical form and the ability to provide good value protection without sacrificing statistical utility. We further explore the impact of various distribution parameters on the performances of privacy protection and utility loss when multiplying twin uniform noise for data masking. An approach to optimise the multiplicative noise scheme with twin unform noise distribution is proposed. We apply the optimisation algorithm to a real accounts payable dataset, and conclude that it yields good results for both privacy and utility.
